Biographical history: For what little is known about Henry Brooke (1771/2-1842), see his entry in the *Oxford Dictionary of National Biography*. For Douglas Sladen (1856-1947), see *The Dictionary of Australasian Biography*.

Scope and content: Papers collected by Henry Brooke in relation to his work as Chief of the Alien Office (c. 1798-1813), in particular his correspondence with members of the French royal family and aristocracy in England during the reign of Napoleon. Also includes a narrative account of his mission to receive Louis XVIII at Yarmouth in 1807. The papers also contain a small collection of material relating to John Wheelton (d. 1861)¹, who was Sheriff of London and Middlesex, and in particular to his refusal to comply with an order of the House of Commons in the matter of Stockdale vs. Hansard, for which he was imprisoned.
