The Chaplain has a background in teaching and academic music specialising in the area of the development of music societies in English Cathedral Cities in the first half of the eighteenth century. This academic year the Chapel Choir is in the hands of Professor Edward Higginbottom, the University's first and only Professor of Choral Music, and former director of the Choir of New College. His long and distinguished career has taken him across the globe, and involved him in recording some 120 CDs, from plainchant to James MacMillan, from William Byrd to Herbert Howells, passing by Handel, Bach, Haydn, Mozart and Brahms. The Music Lists for St Peter's Chapel will reflect the breadth and diversity of his musical interests, also represented in his many ongoing freelance activities.
